The Coastal Inundation shown in the Auckland Unitary Plan – Operative in Part "Controls" map corresponds to the 1% AEP plus 1m sea-level rise Coastal Inundation scenario calculated at the time the Unitary Plan was established. The Coastal Inundation data shown in the "Special Land Features – Natural Hazards - Coastal Inundation" map is also shown on the Auckland Council Online map viewer (Geomaps) and is subject to updates to reflect our latest, best available understanding of coastal inundation and sea-level rise processes.

Storm surge is the rise in sea-level due to meteorological effects. The 1% AEP coastal-storm inundation is at a level that has a 1% chance of being equalled or exceeded per year.

Sea-level rise values are based on the projections by the Intergovernmental Panel on Climate Change fifth assessment report (2015). One meter sea-level rise is representative of the upper bound scenario to 2115. Two meter sea-level rise is representative of potential, longer term sea-level rise (2120 to approximately 2200).

The lines are based on data from a regional study ("Predicting Auckland's Exposure to Coastal Instability and Erosion", available on the Council website). The lines may not take into account local variability, and are not intended for site-specific use.

Development on sites affected by potential coastal erosion may be subject to Auckland Unitary Plan activity controls and may require a detailed coastal hazard assessment report to be completed by a qualified expert.

Any escape of gas or liquid from the pipelines is potentially dangerous and requires immediate action as soon as discovered (Dial 111 and ask for the Fire Service).

### 15.0 TIME PERIOD IN WHICH TO IMPLEMENT THE CONSENT.

Under section 125 of the Resource Management Act 1991, unless it is given effect to, a consent lapses either on the date that is specified in the consent or if no date is specified, five years after the date of commencement of the consent.

A standard five-year period in which to give effect to a consent is not considered appropriate in relation to vegetation because a five-year period would allow a substantial change in the size and status of the vegetation due to natural growth, to the point where it should more appropriately be reassessed.

It is recommended that this period be restricted to two years in this instance. This would provide sufficient time to carry out the proposal without a significant change in the vegetation necessitating reassessment. Under section 125 of the Resource Management Act 1991, unless it is given effect to, this consent lapses two years after the date of commencement.

### 16.0 MONITORING

The proposal will need to be monitored in accordance with the conditions specified in this report, and the requirements contained in the District Plan.

### 17.0 RECOMMENDED DECISION

Pursuant to Sections, 104, 104C, and 108 of the Resource Management Act 1991, being satisfied that no body or person is adversely affected, consent is granted to the application by Richard and Lynley Marquart to remove one exotic tree (1x Indian Bead tree – *Melia azedarach*) located at 17 Western Road, Laingholm, Auckland, that site being legally known as Lot 267 DP 19098 for the following reasons:

- (i) The subject tree has outgrown the limited quality growing environment originally provided for it.
- (ii) The planting of suitably selected replacement vegetation will of set the loss of the subject tree by helping to maintain the immediate areas existing amenity values and neighbourhood character.
- (iii) The proposal is consistent with the objectives and policies of the Operative District Plan.

# Conditions imposed on the consent are as follows:

- (VEG 01) Subject to the conditions outlined below, the vegetation alteration shall proceed in accordance with the information submitted with the application, dated 20<sup>th</sup> October 2011, and referenced by Council as LUC 2011-1175. The vegetation clearance shall be limited to the removal of the one exotic trees as described in the application, this report and identified in the site photograph in section 2 of this report.
- (VEG 02) The removal of the subject exotic vegetation shall be undertaken by appropriately trained and skilled persons in accordance with modern arboricultural practices to avoid damage to or death of other protected vegetation growing beneath or alongside.
- (VEG 03) Within the planting season (typically Apr Sept) immediately following the proposed tree removal the resource consent holder shall plant within the front yard area of the site two suitably selected new trees. The new trees

shall be of a minimum of PB\* Grade 40 or equivalent. It shall be the responsibility of the resource consent holder to provide evidence of this replacement planting to Council's Environmental Monitoring Officer in the form of an invoice or similar.

(VEG 04) The replacement trees shall be of good quality nursery stock and maintained to the satisfaction of Council for a period of two years from the date of planting. If any of the replacement new trees die within this period they shall be replaced and maintained as per these stated conditions.

[\*This is a horticultural term referring to the pint bag size the tree has been grown in. A tree nursery or garden centre will be able to advise you with respect to fulfilling the outlined requirements].

- (VEG 05) A copy of this Resource Consent shall be held on site throughout the period of work.
- (VEG 06) Pursuant to Section 125 of the Resource Management Act 1991, this consent shall lapse after a period of two years from the commencement of the consent. The vegetation clearance shall be undertaken within two years of the issue of this consent. If this does not happen the consent lapses and a new consent will need to be applied for.

### **Advice Notes:**

- If you disagree with any of the above conditions relating to the processing of the application you have a right of objection pursuant to sections 357A or 357B of the RMA. Any objection must be made in writing to Council within 15 working days of notification of the decision.
- Please read the conditions of this resource consent carefully and make sure that you understand all the conditions that have been imposed before commencing the development.
- 3. The consent holder shall obtain all other necessary consents and permits, including those under the Building Act 2004, and the Historic Places Trust Act 1993. This consent does not remove the need to comply with all other applicable Acts (including the Property Law Act 2007), regulations, relevant Bylaws, and rules of law. This consent does not constitute building consent approval. Please check whether a building consent is required under the Building Act 2004. Please note that the approval of this resource consent, including consent conditions specified above, may affect a previously issued building consent for the same project, in which case a new building consent may be required.
- 4. Compliance with the consent conditions will be monitored by Council in accordance with section 35(d) of the Resource Management Act. This will typically include site visits to verify compliance (or non compliance) and documentation (site notes and photographs) of the activity established under the Resource Consent. Only after all conditions of the Resource Consent have been met, will Council issue a letter on request of the consent holder.
